Before she could reach new heights, her flourishing business was badly hit by a disastrous flood in 2014 which not only washed her livelihood but also hopes for a better future.

Encouragements and motivations from the family paved way for a new failoring business and interactions with Clok helped in capacity building trainings, design development assistance and making of a new age entrepreneur.
