### BUILDING TAILORING SKILLS - A SKILL TRAINING WORKSHOP AT NIFT

Ctok in collaboration with NIFT, Delhi helped two of its Aari artisans Sajad Dar and Anjuman Ara to enhance their fabric construction skills through an intensive 5 day training workshop from 13th - 17th November 2017 under the guidance of Professor Sudha Dhingra and Associate Professor Mr. KD Sharma.

On the CtoK project, both the artisans aspired to combine together the skill of Aari embroidery and Tailoring with an aim to produce a new range of stitched fabrics and home furnishings with embroidered patters and designs on them. The CtoK-NIFT collaboration on capacity building proved to be an important milestone in realisation of ambitions of our Aari entrepreneurs.

### A STARTUP BY BASHARAT ASHRAF WHICH SUPPORTS WOMEN EMPOWERMENT Basharat Ashraf is an upcoming & ambitious young entrepreneur from Srinagar who with his unique

leadership skills leads as many as 30 women embroiders. He joined CtoK with a hope to support his startup with design development and market acquisition.

Under the umbrella of CtoK, Basharat is being led by textile designer, Chandrashekhar Bheda and together they are working on a range of rugs, cushion-cover combinations with patterns from walnut wood carvings and a range of paisley and flower bags, pouches inspired from local flora and fauna. CtoK's intervention with Basharat's start up, reaches out to the hitherto hidden part of the Kashmir economy - women artisans who work to keep the traditional craft skill alive.
